Château Carbonnieux, located in the Pessac-Léognan appellation of Bordeaux, is a historic estate founded in the 13th century and classified as Grand Cru Classé de Graves for both red and white wines. Owned by the Perrin family since 1956, it spans about 95–100 hectares, producing elegant reds and fresh, mineral-driven whites primarily from Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Sauvignon Blanc, and Sémillon. Known for sustainability, the estate holds HVE3 certification and offers wine tourism experiences. Its second wines include *La Croix de Carbonnieux* and *Château Tour Léognan*, and it remains celebrated for quality and tradition across centuries. Tasting Notes:

#### Nose

Fresh and vibrant aromas of **citrus fruits** (lemon, grapefruit), **white peach**, and **pear**.

Floral hints of acacia and hawthorn, with subtle mineral notes.

Light touch of vanilla and toast from oak aging.

#### Palate

Crisp and lively acidity with a medium body.

Flavors of lime zest, green apple, and tropical fruit (pineapple).

Balanced by a creamy texture from lees aging, finishing with a **long, mineral-driven finish**.

#### Critics' Impressions

**James Suckling:** Notes of citrus and stone fruit, elegant and fresh. **Wine Enthusiast:** Structured, with good aging potential (5–8 years).

**Decanter**: Bright, pure fruit with a saline edge.

# Description

The name "Batailley" comes from battles that reportedly took place on the estate during the Hundred Years' War. Since 2017, the property has been managed by the Cazes family, who continue the classic Médoc style.

# **Tasting Notes**

**Appearance**: Deep ruby red with purplish-blue hues, indicating youth and vibrancy.

#### Nose

Aromas of **spice** (notably pepper), **scrubland herbs**, and **black fruits** like **blackcurrant** and **blackberry**. Additional notes include **cedar**, **tobacco**, **basil**, **toast**, and a hint of **vanilla**.

#### Palate

Medium-bodied with a **clean and frank attack**, balanced by **enveloping tannins**. Flavors of **dark berries**, **plum**, **charred wood**, **forest floor**, and **earthy undertones**. A **smooth mouthfeel**, with a **dry**, **mineral-tinged finish** and **high acidity** 

#### Structure:

Silky tannins, medium (+) acidity, and a medium (+) finish.

Described as **accessible**, **harmonious**, and **well-integrated**, with good potential for short- to midterm aging

#### Description

Echo de Lynch-Bages is the **second wine** of the prestigious **Château Lynch-Bages** estate in Pauillac, Bordeaux. Originally known as **Château Haut-Bages Averous**, it was renamed in **2008** to better reflect its connection to the Grand Vin. The name "Echo" is inspired by the **Greek mythological nymph Echo**, symbolizing elegance and subtlety.

#### **Tasting Notes**

## Aromatics

**James Suckling:** Intense graphite, violet, and lead pencil. Iodine notes add depth. "Super second wine" reminiscent of Lynch's grand vin from the 1980s.

**Lisa Perrotti-Brown**: Baked black and red cherries, plum preserves, blackcurrant cordial, tobacco leaf, and leather.

**Decanter**: Bramble fruit, toasty aromas, soft florality, and graphite grip. **Wine Cellar Insider**: Red currants, tobacco leaf, spice, floral and sweet notes.

#### Palate

Medium-bodied with succulent, grainy tannins and a chewy texture.

Saline and savory finish with freshness and elegance.

Structured and serious, with fine tannins and a cool grip.

Juicy, vibrant, and refined with a plump core of red fruit.

The Pauillac de Latour 2015 is a compelling third wine from the prestigious Château Latour estate in Bordeaux, offering a refined yet approachable expression of the Pauillac terroir

**Appearance**: Deep garnet to ruby red with violet hues, reflecting its youthful vibrancy.

#### Nose:

Aromas of blackberries, blackcurrants, and black cherry preserves. Subtle layers of cocoa, vanilla, licorice, spice box, and tobacco. Hints of graphite, sandalwood, and potpourri add complexity.

Palate: Medium-bodied with a silky texture and velvet tannins.

Flavors of cassis, cherry, chocolate, and dark fruits dominate. Balanced by **fresh acidity** and a **discreet minerality** on the finish.

Some tasters noted a slightly astringent or tight finish, suggesting it benefits from decanting or further aging.

#### Structure:

Well-structured with fine tannins and a lingering finish.
